Introducing PCSO Janine Diamond and Beverly Owen. PCSO Diamond has been in the role for 4 years and PCSO Owen is newly appointed to the role in Northway.



They answer some Frequently Asked Questions.

What is the role of a PCSO?

PCSOs conduct high-visibility patrols. Their role also includes dealing with minor offences, providing crime prevention advice and helping to tackle antisocial behaviour.

What hours does a PCSO normally do?

They normally patrol to 6pm as part of their shift pattern, but sometimes work up to 11pm. They can attend evening meetings provided there are no other commitments.

What areas does our PCSOs cover?

They share the smaller communities and help out in each other areas.

Do PCSOs deal with noise nuisances?

The Borough Environmental Health department investigates most noise nuisance. The types of noise complaints include unreasonable and persistent noise.

- Drunken people shouting in the streets.
- Domestic music and parties.
- Noise from pubs, licensed premises and events.
- Building sites and industrial premises.
- Barking dogs.
- Domestic and commercial alarms.

What should 101 be used for?

It is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 101 is the number to use to contact the police when you don't need an immediate response. For example, if your car has been stolen, your property has been damaged, or you want to give the police information about crime in your area.

999 is still the number to call when when a crime is in progress, when someone suspected of a crime is nearby, when a life is in danger or when violence is being used or threatened.
